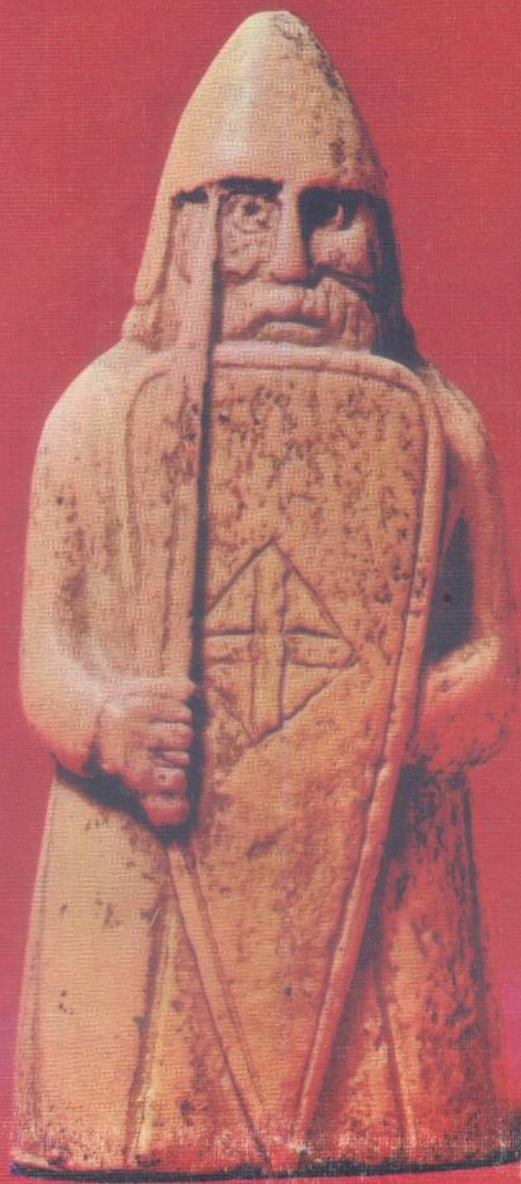

A history of Britain



This book introduces British history from the beginning of the Middle Ages down to the death of Elizabeth I. Significant and interesting detail helps to bring the past to life and the author's full use of original source material (both pictorial and literary) helps the reader to judge some of the evidence for himself. Miss Chancellor explains the main political, social and cultural trends of the period and, where possible, relates them to the present. This book was written at a time when the author was herself teaching in a secondary modern school and it includes many of the approaches which she found successful in communicating to others the meaning of history.

This volume is part of a 5-volume history of Britain. Each book has maps, source materials, over 150 illustrations integrated with the text, reading lists and suggestions for further individual work.
